## **Education Seminar on School violence and drug-free campus, 10 August 2011**

A seminar sponsored by the ACEI-HKM and Hong Kong Teachers' Centre was organized with 45 participants. Speakers were Mr. Michael Kam (President of ACEI-HKM) and a Police Officer of Hong Kong Police Force.
